BOARD ADOPT THE FOLLOWING POLICY CHANGES RECOMMENDED BY FORETHOUGHT CONSULTING:

1. CAMERAS IN SPECIAL EDUCATION CLASSROOMS: File IDDFC – NEW POLICY

Effective: upon approval

In 2021 legislation was passed creating La. Rev. Stat. Ann. §17:1948, relative to parental requests for cameras to be placed in certain classrooms. The legislation was contingent on such request and also required available funding. Act 588, revised the statute making it mandatory for each School Board to adopt policies relative to the installation and operation of cameras that record both video and audio in a classroom no later than December 31, 2022, and submit the policies to the state Department of Education no later than January 15, 2023. The policy Cameras in Special Education Classrooms includes references to the required procedures, including how parents can request the installation and operation of cameras, a procedure for approval or denial of a request, and procedures for parents who request to review a recording.
