This price includes the purchase of the new Tier I Math curriculum for high school (Springboard) which was already approved by the school board this spring, and a renewal of the Tier I Math curriculum for grades K-8 (Eureka). The materials purchased are consumable and cost approximately \$130,000. Teacher Editions for Springboard will be provided at no cost.

In addition, a new Tier I curriculum for ELA K-1 (Amplify CKLA) will be purchased at a cost of \$40,000. This is only a portion of the total cost. Another \$72,381 will be paid for by Title I school budget funds, and Redesign funds. First grade materials for Lake Arthur Elementary and James Ward Elementary, as well as second grade materials for all schools, were purchased in 2018-19 from SRCL and REAP grant funds.

A new Tier I Science curriculum (PhD Science) will be purchased for grades 3-5 at an approximate cost of \$20,000.

The remainder of the budget will include the renewal of a web-based keyboarding program for grades 3-12 (Edutyping), Dual Enrollment textbooks and digital online access as well as costs for any new instructional texts for Science grades 6-12, CTE (Career and Technical Education), and replacement texts for ELA grades 3-12, or added course texts for all other curriculum areas.

The following recommendations are being made from sealed quotes received on May 22, 2019 for the 2019-2020 Insurance Program, with a second year renewal guaranteed under provisions of the Insurance RFP:

1. Accept the quote provided by Arthur J. Gallagher (AJG) for a package quote for General Liability, Errors & Omissions, and Auto/Fleet Insurance through Hudson Specialty/Euclid Insurance for a total premium cost of \$130,500, with Terrorism coverage rejected. AJG provided another quote from Berkley Insurance in the amount of \$166,035. This is a decrease of\$17,250 from last year's package quote. Jeff Davis Insurance (JDI) did provide a quote from Indian Harbor Insurance for Errors & Omissions Insurance only in the amount of \$52,867.

4. Accept the quote of LWCC for Workers Compensation Insurance in the amount of \$360,003, which is an increase in premium of \$44,598 from the previous year. Our claims experience has declined in the last couple of years due to some expensive claims. Note: The quoted premium does not include a premium divided rebate which has averaged approximately \$139,000 over the last five years. The policy will still be serviced by AJG for a negotiated fee of \$5,000 per year.

AMRISC did provide 9 other options to consider with variables in the percentage deductible on buildings damaged by hurricanes, named storms, and wind-driven rain per location. The administration is recommending the quote above that includes a 2% Hurricane deductible per building value, a \$100,000 deductible for all other wind events up to a maximum of \$2,606,539 per occurrence with a trailing deductible of \$100,000 if a second Hurricane event occurs. Another quote from AJG was offered through a Lloyd's of London syndicate in the amount of \$612,176.
